Many of you may or may not be aware but LARGC has implemented a new policy. On public days any visitors to the range are required to have a safety review and a safety test in order to use the range. This is a one-time occurrence Cards are issued to those successfully completing the review and passing the test. While in the beginning it has slowed the entry process and required additional staff it has proven to be extremely successful. Many of you as members are not aware of the issues, concerns and problems that arise on a public day. This process has dramatically cut down on those occurrences, and solved many problems that occurred from well-meaning and safety conscious visitors simply not knowing the rules and proper procedures. The process is not as detailed as you have all experienced with the orientation you have completed with Brian as there is much more for a member to be aware of. And no, as a member, you are not required to take this test or receive a card to shoot on public days. Unless of course you would like to take it for your own edification. This will continue to be required for all first time visitors or returning visitors that have not before taken the safety entrance test. We have seen the dramatic improvements, members should have peace of mind knowing there is a certain level of safety and common sense that must be exhibited by all shooters to be allowed to use the facility.

RANGE UPDATES

Don't forget the first Tuesday of each month the 40 yard range is dedicated to 3 gun. With the growing interest and positive feedback we are considering opening it up to 3 gun on one or two more days each month. They will be pre-arranged and published on the calendar so the dates are available well in advance for those of you planning on attending the range on those days for either 3 gun or just to shoot. The Board is experimenting with various surfaces (carpet or artificial turf) for the Tin Can on 3 gun days and the 2P. If you see various surfaces on those ranges and have any positive or negative comment please forward them to the club at rangemaster@largc.com.

Shortly you will see the pistol range undergo minor changes. Our plan is to dig a pit behind the targets and fill it with ballistic sand. This will serve a couple purposes. It will allow us to lower the targets to keep the high shots in the ballistic sand on the back stop. Currently high shots are above the level the ballistic sand can be stacked. By filling the pit with ballistic material we will not need to worry about shots skipping upward or the bullets imbedding outside of ballistic sand on the backstop and then migrating to other ranges and eventually off property. Containing the spent bullets in a smaller area helps prevent the migration, allows for harvesting and removal and helps prevent fly back when newly fired bullets strike older imbedded ones. So it helps with safety, migration or environmental concerns and reduces expenses in harvesting the old bullets.

PRO SHOP

Again, ammo is available for purchase in bulk at cost if prearranged with Hal Netter. Be sure to inquire with Hal. He is happy to accommodate you for the upcoming Labor Day Picnic with one caveat. The order must be pre-paid and placed at least three weeks prior to the picnic so he has time to get it on site. Otherwise the best he can do is take whatever we have in stock which may not be enough if we have any of your requested caliber at all. He will set it aside for pick up prior to the BBQ lunch commencing so he is not dealing with ammo orders all day and can enjoy the festivities as well. First thing that morning would be great, any day before the picnic is even better. The availability and pricing is very good so be sure to take advantage of one of the benefits of your membership and partake in the discounts.

RULE REVIEW

Each Newsletter we will remind you of Two of our Rules Remember on the Non-Public or Member days each of you are Range Safety Officers (RSO's).

NEVER HAND A LOADED GUNS TO ANYONE.

Before changing shooters, unload and place the gun on the shooting station-with its muzzle pointed down range at your target-then allow the next shooter to pick it up.

CLEAN-UP.

All shooters are responsible for removing their own targets (including "tin can" targets) and empty shotgun hulls and cartridge casings (brass, steel, etc.) Blue garbage cans are provided on the Range for your trash. White buckets are for empty casings. Tan buckets on the Shotgun Ranges are for shotgun hulls. You may remove only your own cartridge casings and shotgun hulls from the Range.
